

Jack Lynch Tunnel Data Protection Notice

Introduction

Transport Infrastructure Ireland (“**TII**”) is the operational name of the National Roads Authority (“**NRA**”) following the dissolution of the Railway Procurement Agency and the transfer of its functions to the NRA in accordance with the Roads Act 2015. TII’s main address is Parkgate Business Centre, Parkgate Street, Dublin 8, D08 DK10, Ireland.

TII is the controller of personal data that is collected and processed when you use the Jack Lynch Tunnel.

TII has appointed Egis Road and Tunnel Operation Ireland Limited (“**ERTO**”) to provide services in relation to the operation of the Jack Lynch Tunnel. ERTO’s contact details are set out below.

As ERTO operates the Jack Lynch Tunnel on behalf of TII, it generally acts as a processor of personal data that is collected and processed in connection with your use of the Jack Lynch Tunnel. This means that TII is still responsible for the processing of your personal data. However, there are limited circumstances where TII and ERTO act as joint controllers of your personal data, or where ERTO acts as a separate and independent controller of your personal data. This notice makes clear where ERTO acts as a joint controller with TII, or as a separate and independent controller.

Purpose of Notice

The purpose of this notice is to inform you of the personal data relating to you that may be collected and processed when you use the Jack Lynch Tunnel.

TII and ERTO fully respect your right to privacy and are committed to protecting your personal data. Any personal data that is processed in relation to the Jack Lynch Tunnel is processed in accordance with applicable data protection law.

Personal Data Processed by ERTO on behalf of TII

The processing of personal data is required in order to operate the Jack Lynch Tunnel. ERTO may collect and process some or all of the following personal data in relation to you on behalf of TII:

Sources of Personal Data

Personal data relating to you may be collected directly from you (e.g. when you use an emergency roadside telephone). As well as collecting information from you directly, information about you and your vehicle may be collected or received from the following sources:

- [the National Vehicle and Driver File, in accordance with specific legislative authority];
- [Foreign vehicle licensing authorities, in the countries in which the vehicle is registered];
- Cameras/CCTV at the Tunnels and on and in the vicinity of the national road network.

Legal Bases

The legal bases on which your personal data is collected, processed and transferred are:

- where such processing is necessary to carry out its tasks in the public interest and/or in the exercise of official authority vested in TII ("**Public Interest/Official Authority**");
- where such processing is necessary for the legitimate interests pursued by ERTO, except where such interests are overridden by the interests or fundamental rights and freedoms of the data subject which require protection of personal data ("**Legitimate Interests**"); and
- your consent ("**Consent**"), where this is the case you will be asked to give a positive indication of that consent.

The legal basis for processing your personal data for the purposes of criminal proceedings is TII's performance of its statutory functions with regard to the prevention, investigation, detection or prosecution of criminal offences.

Purposes of processing activities and associated legal bases for TII and ERTO's processing of personal data as joint controllers

TII and ERTO jointly process personal data for the following purpose:

Transfers Abroad

In connection with the above, your personal data may be transferred outside the European Economic Area to service providers in the USA, India and/or the United Kingdom. In such circumstances, appropriate measures are put in place to comply with obligations under applicable law governing such transfers:

- Transfer to the United Kingdom are made on the basis of the EU Commission's decision that the United Kingdom's laws in relation to the protection of personal data provide an adequate level of protection.
- Transfers to the USA are made on the basis of contracts governing such transfers that contain 'standard contractual clauses' approved by the European Commission.
- Transfers to the India are made on the basis of contracts governing such transfers that contain 'standard contractual clauses' approved by the European Commission.
- Transfer to South Africa are made on the basis of contracts governing such transfers that contain 'standard contractual clauses' approved by the European Commission.

Recipients of Data

TII (and ERTO on behalf of TII) may disclose any of your personal data detailed in the *“Purposes of processing activities and associated legal bases for TII’s processing as controller”* section above to other organisations in connection with the above purposes, in the following circumstances:

- TII may share personal data with our agents, contractors, emergency services and service providers who assist us with the operation of aspects of our services and functions, such as insurance services, legal services, foreign vehicle licensing authorities (where necessary to identify vehicles and the owners of vehicles in connection with damage caused to property at the Jack Lynch Tunnel), law enforcement agencies and maintenance contractors, for example for our CCTV, Dashcams, phone systems, IT and web services.
- Where TII appoints a new operator of the Jack Lynch Tunnel (as successor service provider to ERTO), TII may share personal data with this new operator in order to facilitate the successful transition to the new operator and to ensure continuity of service.
- Where TII is under a duty to disclose or share personal data in order to comply with any legal obligation, or to protect the rights, property or safety of TII or ERTO, our customers, or others.
- Where required or permitted by law, we may share your personal data with other public authorities and bodies, such as the Gardaí or other law enforcement authorities for the purposes of the prevention, investigation, detection, or prosecution of criminal offences or the execution of criminal penalties.
- Passage metadata may be shared with key stakeholders, e.g. the Department of Transport, for the purposes of research and statistical analysis.
- Where we are otherwise permitted by law.

ERTO and TII, as joint controllers, may each disclose any of your personal data detailed in the *“Purposes of processing activities and associated legal bases for TII and ERTO’s processing of personal data as joint controllers”* section above to other organisations in connection with the above purposes, in the following circumstances:

- TII and ERTO may share personal data with our agents, contractors, and service providers who assist us with the operation of aspects of our services and functions, including our legal advisors who may assist us in making a claim for damage to the Jack Lynch Tunnel and associated infrastructure.
- Where TII or ERTO are under a duty to disclose or share personal data in order to comply with any legal obligation, or to protect the rights, property or safety of TII or ERTO, our customers, or others.
- Where required or permitted by law, we may share your personal data with other public authorities and bodies, such as the Gardaí or other law enforcement authorities for the purposes of the prevention, investigation, detection, or prosecution of criminal offences or the execution of criminal penalties.
- Where we are otherwise permitted by law.

In the following circumstances, ERTO may process personal data that it collected on behalf of TII for its own purposes as an independent controller:

- For the purposes of management of ERTO staff, ERTO may process:
 - CCTV images which capture the Jack Lynch Tunnel or the road network and vicinity, including any incident of an attack on ERTO staff; and/or
 - Call recordings on telephone lines operated by ERTO on behalf of TII.
- For the purposes of pursuing claims up to a specified level against third parties for damage to property as agreed between TII and ERTO, ERTO may process CCTV images of incidents, vehicle registration, name and contact details.

Retention

Generally, your personal data will only be retained for as long as necessary for the purpose or purposes for which it was obtained, including for the purposes of satisfying any legal, accounting, or reporting requirements. The retention periods differ depending on the type of categories of personal data held.

To determine the appropriate retention period for personal data, we consider the amount, nature, and sensitivity of the personal data, the potential risk of harm from unauthorised use or disclosure of your personal data, the purposes for which we process your personal data and whether we can achieve those purposes through other means, and the applicable legal requirements. Further specific information on TII's and ERTO's retention practices in relation to the processing activities discussed above can be requested using the contact details below.

Necessity of provision of certain information and consequences

You are not under a statutory obligation to provide ERTO or TII with any personal data. However, if you raise a query then we may not be in a position to deal with your query and respond to you if you do not provide us with sufficient information, e.g. your contact details.

Security of Your Information

TII and ERTO have adopted appropriate technical and organisational security measures to protect your information from unauthorised access and against unlawful processing, accidental loss, destruction or damage. We will also ensure that our agents or third-party service providers who process your data are required to keep your data safe and secure.

Your Rights

You have the following rights, in certain circumstances, in relation to your personal data:

- *the right to access your personal data* – You have the right to request a copy of the personal data that we hold about you, together with other information about our processing of that personal data;
- *the right to request the rectification of your personal data* – You have the right to request that any inaccurate data that is held about you is corrected, or if we have incomplete information you may request that we update the information such that it is complete;
- *the right to request the erasure of your personal data* – You have the right to request us to delete personal data that we hold about you. This is sometimes referred to as the right to be forgotten;
- *the right to restrict the use of your personal data* – You have the right to request that we no longer process your personal data for particular purposes;
- *the right to object to the processing of your personal data* – You have the right to object to our processing of your personal data for particular purposes;

- *the right to data portability* – You have the right to receive your personal data, which you provided to us, in a structured, commonly used machine readable format or to require us to transmit that data to another data controller; and
- *the right to withdraw your consent* – where our processing of your personal data is based on you having provided consent, the right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time.

Please note that these rights are not absolute and are subject to certain restrictions and exemptions. For example, the right to erasure of personal data will not apply where we have a legitimate reason to continue to hold such data and we may continue to process your personal data, despite an objection by you, where we have compelling legitimate grounds for the processing which override your interests, rights and freedoms.
